
# GYM AND AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES FOR SENIOR CYCLE STUDENTS



### **MEITHEAL LEADERS 2021**

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Our time as Meitheal leaders was a learning experience for both the first years and us. It was a great opportunity for the first years to make new friends and give them a chance to come out of their comfort zone to overcome the transition from primary school to secondary school, as some students find this more challenging than others. The Meitheal leaders program is designed to reduce the amount of stress caused by this transition.

This program has allowed us, as leaders to learn many skills that we did not have before such as; teamwork skills, we developed this skill when we worked together to introduce ourselves to the first years as we helped them find their classes. Another skill we got to improve on was our leadership skills. This program allowed us to show by example and lead the first years. Finally, the last skill we got to improve on was public speaking. For this program we had to give instructions to the first years and give advice to them, by telling them about our

experiences as first years, for example showing them how to be organised for classes, etc. We learned and developed these skills through and intense one-day course, which was taught by Mr.Nolan and Mrs.Roche. On this day, previous Meitheal leaders attended this course in order to teach us these skills and give us advice on how to help the first years.

The Meitheal leaders program let us become closer and create a bond with the first years. Our aim for this was to make the first years aware that we were people that they could come and ask for help, if they needed anything we would always be there, to talk and support them, not just during the course but all throughout their school years.

This was an experience of a lifetime and we feel that we will be able to bring what we learned during this time with us into the future. We will be able to use the skills we developed in our course, in our own life.

We are very glad we were given the opportunity to become Meitheal leaders, as it has helped both the first years and us greatly.
