Welcome to our First Year Newsletter for parents and students. The students have adapted to their new school environment with ease and are working really well in all their new subjects. Now that the option rotation period is over, student timetables have been finalized. First Year is a busy year, settling in and embracing all the new subjects. A reminder to parents that:

- 1. Absent notes need to be uploaded on VS Ware so that they can be authorised by us.
- 2. If a student is leaving for an appointment or returning to school from an appointment, they need to **sign-out** and **sign-in** at **reception**. This should also be recorded by the parent on VS Ware.
- 3. All **behaviour issues** are now recorded on VS Ware -parents/guardians should check this feature regularly to keep track of how their child is doing.
- 4. VS Ware is a parent app and students should not be given access to the sign in details.
- 5. First year students are expected to complete **one and a half hours homework per night** and complete at least **thirty minutes reading** for their AR Challenge. All homework should be written into their homework journals which you are asked to sign at least once a week.

Homework

In terms of homework, we expect that there is a genuine attempt made by the student to complete the homework to the best of his/her ability and to submit the work at an agreed time.

Homework is a very important part of learning. It helps us to build on what we have learned in class, to practice skills, to ensure we understand new topics/concepts and to prepare for the next class/exam.

The Homework Journal is the place where all homework is recorded. Homework is recorded at the end of each class and students have been reminded that there are many different types of homework; writing, learning, reading, researching and drawing. Parents and guardians should ensure that the student completes all homework to the best of his/her ability and should sign the homework journal each week (Thursday night is best).

First year students are expected to complete 1.5 hours of homework a night.

If your son/daughter is struggling with their homework please contact me and we can arrange support for him/her.

Accelerated Reading

All classes are up and running with their Accelerated Reader books and are really enjoying getting stuck into some great stories! Increased reading will bring you huge rewards! The Accelerated Reading Challenge motivates, monitors and manages students' independent reading. Your sons/daughters are all encouraged to read books at their own reading levels. They test on completion of the book and accumulate points which will help monitor their progress.

Each student is expected to read for at least 30 minutes per day. Students can now test at home using the AR link which Ms O Brien uploaded on to our First Year Team.

Information Technology

Here in St. Caimin's we use a 'digital learning platform' to assist with teaching, learning and assessment. Working on the Microsoft 365 platform, students have access to Microsoft Teams where they can communicate and collaborate on classwork as well as receive updates on what is happening in general school life. Students also have free access to apps like Word, Excel, PowerPoint where the school pays a subscription on the student's behalf. These can be accessed via the main Office 365 Portal at www.office.com. At the beginning of the year all first year students attended an ICT induction session where computer account details were provided (see sticker added inside journal) and students got up and running with computers for the first time. Many students are now also actively using Microsoft teams on their mobile phones. We encourage parents/guardians to be aware of their children's use of this platform and engage with them on this. Where technical issues are encountered, and support is required, the school operates an ICT Helpdesk which is available to students, but parents can now also feel free to use this support. Our Acceptable Use Policy should be reviewed and school accounts may only be used for educational purposes.

Surfing in Lahinch

Every year Mr. Forde and a trusted group of teachers take our first year students on a trip to Lahinch surfing. The students are always eager and enthusiastic to head off and this year was no different. On Thursday and Friday, October 3rd and 4th bus loads of excited first years left the school and embarked on a fun filled, if exhausting, day out.
